Singing is an oral history

Let the girls lead songs.....songs they learned at camps, at home, at school, at family events

Make sure songs are appropriate for the girls ages – songs for Seniors might not be the right ones for Daisys

To learn a song - teach it by "I sing a line, you sing it back to me"

You learn songs in many places, and the same song might be taught differently in California than in New York, so the person teaching or leading the song, is one that you follow. Next time you can lead the song and do it the "right way" BUT there is no right or wrong way to sing a song in Girl Scouting.

Ask an older Girl Scout to come to your meeting and teach a song

Brownie's can teach Daisys and adults Juniors can teach Brownies and Daisys and adults Cadettes can teach Daisys, Brownies, and Juniors and adults Daisys, Seniors and Ambassadors can teach anyone

Sing songs, camp songs, folk songs, rounds, Disney, repeat after me songs, made up songs Have FUN
